NEWS AND NEEDS

BIM:

We thank you all that both of our students have the support needed. However, we need your help to find men, young and old, who would be suitable to train to proclaim the Word of God to the lost. Please help us seek out men who will give their lives in preaching the gospel.

Zambia:

We are still in need of repairing a portion of the wall around the school due to flood damage. The cost of repairing the wall is \$ 1,300. Also, our school van is needing repairs that will cost \$700. This will help us to get ready for the next class in February of next year. Thank you for considering this need.

Uganda:

The transformer at the school has burned up and it will cost \$4,000 to replace it. Because of corruption, we are unable to get the one replaced by the suppliers. Court cost would be more than the replacement of the transformer. We need to get it installed before February of next year. Any help would be appreciated.

Ghana:

We thank you very much for great support in our needs this year. In the coming months we need to address the fact that we are still under budget each month with monthly support. Hopefully, in the near future, you will be able to consider this need and help as able so that we can finally meet our monthly budget.



Exodus/Leviticus Life of Christ 2 (Luke)
Prison Epistles English Grammar 2
NT Church Preacher and His Work 2

Both Chase Sullins and Isaac Hoffman are still doing well so far. They both started speaking in chapel this quarter for the first time. Soon, they will be ready to start going out to preach. They are progressing quickly in their training process.

Consider the following account. "Moses' hands became heavy; so they took a stone and put it under him, and he sat on it. And Aaron and Hur supported his hands, one on one side, and the other on the other side; and his hands were steady until the going down of the sun" (Exodus 17:12). Sometime next year, possibly in July, 16 men will have their graduation to honor their labors.

On February 2, 2021, we will endeavor to start our 16th class of 25 students. As Jesus said, "The harvest truly is plentiful, but the laborers are few." Therefore, we will continue to strive to furnish trained gospel preachers for Zambia. They will not only lead the lost to Christ but will strengthen the over 800 churches of Christ that are already established in that country. The work of God is still growing in Zambia. Uganda

With the Covid pandemic going on no political rallies can take place. Consequently, the entire country will probably be shut down until the elections are over. We do think that we will be able to open early next year and hopefully in February. In the meantime, evangelism is still taking place under the watchful eyes of the authorities to make sure that the restrictions placed on the people by the government are obeyed. We ask for you continued prayers for the ongoing work in Uganda.
