BIM:

Zambia:

We will be graduating 16 more men this coming December. Can you help us make it through the year and be prepared for the next class in February? We are still seeking support for the operation of this school. We also need help fixing a school van and a wall that was damaged by wind. The cost of the van repair will be \$700 and the wall replacement will be \$ 1,300. Any help would be greatly

Uganda:

Recently, we had to pay another registration fee for the school as the government continues to find ways to charge non-government organizations. We are having to pay \$1,280 and that will probably cover two years. We are happy to be in East Africa and know that many souls will be saved in eternity because of the efforts we all are making in that region of Africa. Help us if you can.

Ghana:

URGENT NEEDS for Ghana. First, Ray needs \$2500 to cover travel tickets to go to graduation in December. Second, we need to pay for two more years for Rent on the school facility in Aboaso, \$3500. Thirdly, we need to pay for another year of rent for the two instructors' homes in Aboaso, \$1500. Finally, we are still \$300 a month below budget in our monthly needs.



The new school year is progressing well so far. The first quarter has quickly come to a close. The students will be completing their final course and taking finals to end the first quarter.




Both Chase Sullins and Isaac Hoffman are doing well so far. Though they are both young, they both are dedicated to the Lord and to the program of studies at the BIM.

Zambia

We are happy to report that the school is still in operation even though the situation with Covid in Zambia has not been improving. So far, there have been no cases of the virus that we know of among the faculty, staff and students and their families. The students are presently nearing the end of their third quarter of studies in their second year. The fourth quarter will begin soon and the Lord willing, graduation will take place in early December of this year. At his time, sixteen students will graduate. The class is made up of fifteen Zambians and one Malawian. So prayers are needed so that we will have a Covid free school until these men are able to graduate.

Evangelism is a part of the work at ZSOBS. Each month a trip to the "bush" is made to either assist with the establishment of a congregation or strengthen the church through Gospel Meetings. Just this past month, a group of six students were taken on a campaign to the Ngwezi Valley. The campaign was held in a local village Mukengami, a place where one our graduates is preaching. The attendance at the meeting was 263 Christians from 17 congregations. Four restorations were recorded. The theme of the meeting was based on Ephesians 5:10-18. Another meeting will be held in another area in October. Our students also preach at several congregations each week in and close to Livingstone.

We continue to need monthly or one time support for the work in Zambia. When this pandemic is over, we will be able to visit churches and raise the support needed for this one school. Uganda

Our school in Uganda, West Africa, has not been able to open due to the "virus" that has been on the increase for several months. Schools are still not open mainly because the government of Uganda is putting such requirements on opening the schools and providing a safe atmosphere for the faculty and students that are impossible. One main reason for the delay is that elections will take place in Uganda in January of next year. So, at this time, no schools, even colleges and universities remain closed.

Because of the uncertain circumstances, our supporters are in agreement that we will only open in February of next year when we are sure we will be free to operate and our Kenyan students will be able to enter the country without restrictions. As the present class had just started its second year of training this year before being closed in March, we will restart the students in their second year and they will graduate at the end of 2021.
